

ADT - ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE TO BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION PATHWAY

Students who have earned an Associate of Science Transfer (AS-T) Degree in Administration of Justice from a California Community College are eligible to waive the general education requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice Administration degree at National University At the time of enrollment, students should have completed a California Community College-ADT program within the last 12 months and be admitted to the National University degree program that correlates to the ADT. Please note the student is required to complete the upper division and cultural diversity general education requirements. Students must complete a minimum of 180 quarter units to complete the **BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION** degree.
